1. How long is the IEHP CHW Certificate Program training?	<ul> <li>The IEHP CHW Certificate Program Training is an 2-week training conducted onsite at the IEHP Dr. Bradley P. Gilbert Center for Learning &amp; Development or the IEHP Atrium.</li> </ul>
2. Where is the IEHP Center for Learning & Development & IEHP Atrium located?	<ul> <li>The Center for learning &amp; Development building is located at 9500 Cleveland Avenue Rancho Cucamonga, CA 91730.</li> <li>The IEHP Atrium is located 10801 Sixth Street Rancho Cucamonga, CA 91730.</li> <li>Image: Comparison of the comparison of</li></ul>
3. When do we receive the Certificate?	<ul> <li>The CHWs will have a graduation on the 12<sup>th</sup> day in person at the IEHP Dr. Bradley P. Gilbert Center for Learning &amp; Development building or IEHP Atrium.</li> <li>Certificate will be provided at the graduation.</li> <li>Invitation will be sent for leaders to attend.</li> </ul>
4. What days and times are the trainings held?	<ul> <li>The training is Monday-Friday 9am-3pm.</li> <li>CHWs are given the afternoon from 3pm-5pm to work on their Capstone projects independently.</li> <li>Attendance is required.</li> </ul>

5. Will there be lunch provided?	<ul> <li>Lunch will not be provided by IEHP.</li> <li>Lunch will be 30 minutes from 12:00pm-12:30pm daily.</li> <li>Refrigerators are onsite if CHW would like to store their food.</li> <li>Microwaves are onsite if CHW would like to warm up their food.</li> <li>The IEHP Lunchbox cafeteria is open Tuesday-Thursday only.</li> </ul>
6. How much participation is required?	Active Participation is required.
7. What topics will the CHWs be trained in?	<ul> <li>By the completion of the CHW training Cohort, the CHW will:</li> <li>be able to identify the physical, behavioral, and social determinants of health experienced by an individual and their community.</li> <li>have obtained knowledge and skills to address the clients/patients' individualized needs by navigating various systems of care.</li> <li>have a solid foundation for understanding the unique needs of underserved and vulnerable San Bernardino/Riverside County populations.</li> </ul>
8. How long is the waiting list?	<ul> <li>Currently there are over 100+ CHWs in the waiting list.</li> <li>Waiting times could be an estimated 2-3 months.</li> </ul>
9. How do I know if my CHW qualifies for the program? And how do I add my CHW to the waiting list?	You will be asked to submit a CHW candidate screener during the contracting process. Once approved, the CHW will be added automatically to the CHW training waitlist and a representative from the CHW training program will reach out to your organization.
